Introduction

- Financing of NGBs in Poland
 - 90% of funding comes from a state budget
 - exceptions to Football (Soccer), Golf, Motorsports
- Research in 2015/2016
 - low percentage of managers have background in management, economy, finance, law
 - mainly they major in sport, PE, coaching
 - lack of knowledge and experience
- Play the Game NSGO 2018
 - Polish NGBs last but one
 - 38% points



Reform

- Preparation in 2017
- Introduction in 2018
 - Change of legislation on sport
 - Transparency
 - Limited terms for board members
- Code of good governance for NGBs
- Academy of Sport Management



Code of Good Governance

- Not legally binding document
- 183 guidelines
- 12 areas eg. strategy, athletes, transparency, finances
- 3 types of guidelines obligatory, partially obligatory, voluntary
- dependency of funding



Academy of Sport Management

- Support for NGBs non formal education
- Seminars and workshops for board members and top managers
- Around 1000 training mandays by now
- Sharing the knowledge and experience among participants
- In cooperation with national and international experts
 - 50/50 practicioners & academics



Issues

Code is quite long and complicated

NGBs are hesitant / trying to keep status quo

No clear strategy for implementation

 The threat of lowering gvt spending for noncompliance
