
## Research project and research question

### Too big to fail?



- Value at risk
- Distress
- Systemic relevance

→ But: no general indicator



#### Too small to win?





- Value at risk
- Distress
- No systemic relevance


→ Depends on the perspective



#### **Anti-Doping as "David and Goliath"**



- Arguments from organizational theory:
  - Flexibility
  - Flat hierarchies
  - Networking/ Communication
  - Context sensitivity
  - → But: reforms are necessary
  - → And: there are trade-offs






