



London 2012 – the curious case of Russia



2011: Aján awarded with the Order of Friendship by Russian President Medvedev

2012: German Federation demanding Aján's resignation < Thomas Bach, then NOC president, interfered in favour of Aján

2013: Aján in Moscow reelected as IWF president, supported by Russia

2. Positiv-Befunde bei den WM im Gewichtheben

Durch das ZI Kreischa wurden vier Positiv-Befunde analysiert betreffend zweimal SU und je einmal BRD und Indonesien.

Ordnungsgemäß wurde dieses Ergebnis dem Generalsekretär der Gewichtheber-Weltföderation, dem Ungarn Ajan mitgeteilt. Dieser bat die genannte Angelegenheit vertraulich zu behandeln.

Wie im Nachhinein bekannt wurde, ist Ajan bei dem sowjetischen Botschafter vorstellig geworden, informierte über den Sachverhalt und kündigte an, daß bei Bekanntwerden zwei sowjetischen Weltmeistern der Titel aberkannt wird verbunden mit einer Nichtteilnahme an den OSS.

Innerhalb von 48 Stunden erschien ein Stellvertreter des Genossen Pawlow und da keine Sanktionen bisher verhängt wurden ist anzunehmen, daß eine Einigung erzielt wurde, indem Ajan diese Situation für sich persönlich nutzte. Bereits seit längerer Zeit ist die SU an der Besetzung der Funktion des Generalsekretärs interessiert und Ajan dürfte sich jetzt auch seine nächste Kandidatur gesichert haben und der Unterstützung durch die SU gewiß sein.

3. Zielstellung der Olympischen Sommerspiele

Gegenüber dem IMV äußerte Genosse Ewald, daß er beabsichtigt einen Antrag an die Parteiführung zu stellen, um die Zielstellung für Moskau zu verändern. Die erneute Erringung des 2. Platzes ist nach realer Einschätzung nicht möglich und es wäre nicht zu verantworten, einen Politbüro-Beschluß nicht zu realisieren.

MfS (Stasi) Files – IM „Technik“

January 1980

reporting on positives for „two Soviet World Champions“

Ajan „went to the Soviet Ambassador, informing him, those cases, if published, would lead to disqualification for the Olympics. ...

Since there was no sanction, I suppose, Aján used the situation for personal gains .“

Aján, later confronted, denied.



Clean Sport Commission Report, November 2017 – Aján's legacy?

New SANCTIONS	3 or more ADRVs/year NF athletes' suspension up to 4 years; officials from IWF activities up to 2 years, no development funds + \$500.000 fine (specific anti-doping-conditions, which, if met, can terminate the sanction earlier)
	2 or more serious ADRVs during Olympic Games disqualification of the country's weightlifting team for the next Games
	(any) ADRVs / Olympic year lead to loss of country's quota spots for the Games or complete ban from the Games
	strict compliance-rules for NFs in case of violations (non-compliance) fine up to \$ 50.000

Vote of no confidence: „will be enforced by a new Independent Member Federation Sanction Panel to ensure that IWF politics cannot affect ... decisions“

Clean Sport Commission Report, November 2017 – Aján's legacy?

Support Personnel

- NFs to provide IWF with updated list of national team athlete's coaches, doctors etc.
- coaches/doctors with more than one athlete with ADRV (or single athlete in case of a minor) > NF obliged to investigate and report to IWF

Testing and Analysis

- increased and more effective no-notice OOC testing with focus on high risk countries
- triple the long term storage of samples including all WRecords , WC medalists for potential retesting

General

- athletes to qualify for Olympics, WC by name, no country slots, to be identified for target testing
- partnering with Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport to manage OOC-testing, test distribution planning etc.

„IWF has made significant enhancements to its Anti-Doping-program over the years, including the appointment of an Independent Anti-Doping Commission consisting of three members in 2014“

Patrick Schamasch: until 2012 IOC Medical Director, then paid by RUSADA, later by Russian Sports Ministry via Russian Skating Federation
